

Answer Key

Comprehension and Vocabulary

- 1. I disagree with the statement. Although giraffes appear gentle and harmless, they are not. The male giraffes attack one another using their heads and legs, so it can be dangerous, especially when children are around.
- 2. They use their necks to maintain balance by swaying backwards and forwards.
- 3. Firstly, the giraffe's tongue is very long at about 45cm. Secondly, it is able to pull out the leaves of acacia trees one by one without being poked by the sharp edges.
- 4. Because of its long neck, a giraffe is able to reach for leaves 5 metres above ground.
- 5. Both of them chew their food before swallowing it. This is followed by regurgitating the food and chewing it again. Both of the animals also have several pockets in their stomach and a long intestine to help them digest food.
